CONSIDERATIONS

I

That the State recognizes the existence of indigenous and Afro-descendant peoples who enjoy the rights, duties and guarantees established in the Constitution and, especially, those of maintaining and developing their identity and culture, having their own forms of social organization and managing their local affairs; as well as maintaining the communal forms of ownership of their lands and the enjoyment, use and enjoyment, all in accordance with the Law.

II

That the National Assembly approved on January 23, 2003, Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, and that in accordance with Article 2. Among the specific objectives are: To regulate the communal property, use and management rights of natural resources in the traditional communal lands of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities; to determine the legal procedures necessary for this recognition, taking into account the full participation of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, through their traditional authorities. Additionally, to establish the fundamental principles of the administrative regime for indigenous peoples and ethnic communities in the management of their communal territories.

III

In accordance with Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Chapter II defines the Communal Authorities and Territorials with Legal representation in Articles. 4 and 5.

That the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples of 2007, in Article 18 states that indigenous peoples have the right to participate in decision-making on issues that affect their rights, through representatives chosen by them in accordance with their own procedures, as well as to maintain and develop their own decision-making institutions and in Article 19 it states that States shall consult and cooperate in good faith with the indigenous peoples concerned through their representative institutions before adopting and implementing legislative or administrative measures that affect them, in order to obtain their free, prior and informed consent

1.2. Methodology Applied for the Free, Prior, Informed Consultation Process to obtain Consent

The methodology applied in the process of prior, free and informed consultation to obtain consent for the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project has been based on the traditional processes of the communities and territories and in accordance with the Political Constitution of the Republic of Nicaragua. , Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008 in Article 1, declares a Special Development Regime for the purposes of Executive Assistance for the Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu and Kipla Sait Tasbaika Indigenous Territories, located in the Upper Wangki and Bokay Basin, Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, among other regulations.

The methodology is based on the principles of traditional norms of indigenous peoples such as common good, collectivity, sharing, good faith, timely information, transparency, interculturality, distribution of benefits, flexibility and equality.

1.3. Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves

The Government of Reconciliation and National Unity managed and obtained financing from the Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI) for a total amount of US\$116.6 million for the Republic of Nicaragua for the execution of the Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves. The resources come from a loan from CABEI and a loan and donation from the Green Climate Fund (GFC), to contribute to combating climate change by reducing emissions caused by deforestation, forest degradation and livestock farming, as well as improving carbon reserves. Additionally, it will directly impact the most vulnerable population in the Nicaraguan Caribbean area, supporting adaptation and reducing the negative effects that climate change has on their livelihoods, and will also improve their standard of living by generating higher incomes. and more jobs.

The implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project is of great importance due to the serious damage caused by hurricanes Eta and Iota in Nicaragua and is estimated to benefit 665,821 inhabitants directly (51,100) and indirectly (614,721) on the Nicaraguan Caribbean Coast and the Alto Wangki and Bokay" through the establishment of sustainable production and forest management and reforestation models in an area that will cover an estimated 603,035 ha.

In general, Bio-CLIMA will increase its carbon absorption capacity by 14% in relation to the reference scenario for 2030, by promoting agroecological production of permanent crops under the shade of trees, which are more resistant to the impacts of climate change; reducing extensive grazing and introducing silvopastoral and cocoa agroforestry systems, establishing planted forests on idle or degraded forest lands; prioritizing the use of natural regeneration of native tree species; restoring and conserving ecosystems and ecosystem services, taking advantage of adaptation and mitigation synergies, with special emphasis on watershed management and risk reduction, including the conservation of biological diversity and protected areas.

The project has three components:

Through this component, activities are focused on: (I) preparation of land and territory use/management plans, preparation of investment plans at community level, productive development (livestock, cocoa) through the establishment of agroforestry and silvopastoral systems; as well as the promotion of ventures for sustainable forest management of timber and non-timber products; (ii) restoration of productive landscapes and reforestation in degraded areas (Indigenous Territories within the BOSAWAS Reserve, the Indio Maíz Biological Reserve and its buffer zones and in twelve indigenous territories with the highest risk of deforestation.

Component 2: Good Governance

The aim of this component is to finance activities focused on guaranteeing compliance with current regulations, standards and legislation regarding forest management, land use and environmental actions to preserve and conserve the Caribbean Region. The interventions aim to create an enabling policy and governance environment by paving the way to transform extensive and destructive forms of land use into climate-resilient sustainable practices especially targeting smallholder farmers and households vulnerable to deforestation.

Component 3: Capacity Development

The component will finance activities focused on promoting training and capacity development. The technical staff of public extension services, producers and beneficiaries will be trained in the management and integrated planning of land use (PDT, POF), implementation and maintenance of productive models of landscape restoration, investment plans and business, innovation in administrative processes, legislation and standards, the strengthening of local organizations, quality management and access to markets.

II MAIN CONTRIBUTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS OF THE REGIONAL ASSEMBLY.

1. Mr. Dorlin López Mora from the Community of San Andrés: I request that when a project for the benefit of the region is approved, it be agreed upon with the 3 territory leaders, in order to guarantee correct implementation.
2. Mrs. Quelita Maxiell Chaves of the Raiti Community: I request more strengthening of the women's organization and I am grateful that they are taken into account in this important process of prior, free, and informed consultation.
3. Mr. Mark Osorno Pikittly of the Raiti Community: We request the integration of component 1 into the KST territory, given that the agricultural frontier has advanced. It is important that the KST territory delve more into the topic and specifically in component 1, because when the project was conceived the KST territory had a very high level of forest, I feel that today the reality of land use is different.
4. Mr. Treminio Solomon Lacayo of the Siksayari Community: I request an update on the actions of component 1, and I request support from MARENA for updates on this same project so that it is analyzed in depth and that component 1 enters the GTI-KST.
5. Ms. Ofelia Francisca Rodriguez: I wish to point out that the Upper Wangki and Bokay region is a great family that cares for and preserves nature and therefore we must continue working in harmony as the brothers of indigenous peoples and lovers of inclusion that we are .
6. Mr. Orlando Dixon Rodriguez of the Amak Community: Stated that once the project is approved, how would the process of disbursement and management of the funds be carried out?

III PRIOR, FREE AND INFORMED CONSULTATION BY A SHOW OF HANDS AND SIGNATURES FOR CONSENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT

The consultation was held in the Miskitu and Spanish languages. The 46 assembly members of the regional assembly were asked to cast a vote by show of hands in favor of the implementation of the project, obtaining 46 votes in favor; 0 votes against and 0 votes of abstention. In accordance with the required quorum of 26 votes in favor, the implementation of the project was approved by the regional assembly of Upper Wangki and Bokay.

The Regional Government of the Special Development Regime of the three territories located in the Upper Wangki and Bokay Basin, together with the three territorial governments of Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu and Kipla Sait Tasbaika, are responsible for ensuring compliance with planning and providing the corresponding follow-up, and must keep the territorial assemblies and the regional assembly informed at least semi-annually in accordance with traditional procedures.

WOMEN: The general makeup of the Assembly consisted of two sources of representation: 1) Management Boards (with 9 to 10 people) where in all three cases there women are represented, and 2) Women's organizations (by territory MITK, KST, MSB) with seven participating people among the positions of presidency, vice-presidency, secretary, treasury, compliance and two other members.

The foregoing also finds expression in the collective decision at the time of casting the vote of consent, in which out of 46 voters, 26 were women and 20 men.

An important factor that facilitated and fostered the full participation of women was the availability at the time of the Assembly of a separate childcare room, with materials for their entertainment or teaching and teachers from the community. This provided a safe space so that women could attend the activity and be fully attentive to the various agenda points.

Another significant aspect to point out is that within the formal agenda of the activity, the opening address was given by the president of one of the women's organizations (WIMPA, from MITK). In addition, during the "Open Dialogue" space, the moderator (Regional President) explicitly requested women's views, and several women, representatives of management boards or women's organizations, gave their opinions on the process and asked questions.

COUNCIL OF ELDERS: Within the integration of the management boards, in two of the three territories (MITK and MSB) there was a person from the Council of Elders as a representative.

YOUNG PERSONS. Although young people (under 25 years of age) were present in the Assembly and on the management boards, and claiming their role as young people, there is no evidence of a representation of organizations expressed in the call or the conformation of the plenary space.

SPORTS ORGANIZATIONS. Some of the management boards included representatives of community sports organizations.

**There is no evidence of participation of people or groups of people with disabilities or LGBTIQ+.

6. Qualitative assessment, concerns or conflicts mentioned by the community

6. (From Kipla SB territory): How will recovery projects be addressed in areas deforested and affected by outsiders?
7. Reiterative expressions by the Kipla Sait Tasbaika territory of its concern and request to be included in component no. 1: "Conserve and produce for life".

Components of the sheet:

2. General participation data / Community (general) expresses barriers to participation:

- People representing the Mayangna Sauni Bu territory state that despite the fact that there is translation, most of the presentations and oral statements are made in Miskito or Spanish, and that some people from their territory do not speak either of these languages, which prevents them from understanding or accessing all the information. They point out that although there is a literal translation of the words, the language or terms are not appropriate or suitable for the population receiving the information.

3. Principles for FPIC development

- **Reasonable term:** No, because there is little time between the presentation of the project, its evaluation and discussion (in an assembly on the same day) and the submission of consent to a vote at the regional level.
- **Timely information:** Not entirely, because there was a population/linguistic group that did not have access to all of the information due to a language aspect.
- **Interculturality:** Not entirely, because the incomplete inclusion of the language of the Mayangna indigenous people does not complete a full approach to compliance with the principle of interculturality.

7. Lessons learned / recommendations / areas for improvement

Differentiate in this space recommendations and areas of improvement for:

- **The organizing institutions of FPIC and MC**
 - It is advisable to establish a general consultation mechanism that, from the world view of each People and Territory, in its autonomy and self-regulation, establishes basic guidelines for the protection of the principles of free, prior and informed consultation.
 - It is necessary to ensure translation into the three languages (Spanish, Miskito, Mayangna), at all times and for all the people who need it (even if they are a "minority").
 - It is recommended that there be more time to understand the project before the decision-making and voting in the pre-consultation phase (to which this document refers).
 - Voting is not recommended during the pre-consultation Assembly.
 - For greater freedom during the voting process, a secret ballot (rather than a public show of hands) is recommended.
 - It is important for security forces (police and army) not to be present in the discussion and voting area (for consent) during an indigenous consultation.

- **United Nations (UNOPS/WFP)**
 - It is recommended that emphasis continue to be given to the roles of UNOPS as observer and of WFP as logistical support, so as not to give participants the impression that these two agencies are responsible for the process.

CONSIDERATIONS

I

That the State recognizes the existence of indigenous and Afro-descendant peoples who enjoy the rights, duties and guarantees established in the Constitution and, especially, those of maintaining and developing their identity and culture, having their own forms of social organization and managing their local affairs; as well as maintaining the communal forms of ownership of their lands and the enjoyment, use and enjoyment, all in accordance with the Law.

II

That the National Assembly approved on January 23, 2003, Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, and that in accordance with Article 2. Among the specific objectives are: To regulate the communal property, use and management rights of natural resources in the traditional communal lands of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities; to determine the legal procedures necessary for this recognition, taking into account the full participation of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, through their traditional authorities. Additionally, to establish the fundamental principles of the administrative regime for indigenous peoples and ethnic communities in the management of their communal territories.

III

In accordance with Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Chapter II defines the Communal Authorities and Territorials with Legal representation in Articles. 4 and 5.

IV

That the aforementioned law states that the Communal Assembly constitutes the highest authority of the indigenous and ethnic communities. The communal authorities represent the communities legally. Each community will decide which communal authority legally represents it. The Territorial Assembly is the highest authority of the territory and is convened according to the procedures established by the group of communities that make up the territorial unit. Communal authorities are traditional administration and government bodies that represent the communities that elect them according to their customs and traditions. Territorial authorities are administrative bodies of the territorial unit which they legally represent.

V

That on May 6, 2010, the National Assembly of Nicaragua approved Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, which requires among other points in Article 6: a. The consultation of the interested peoples, through appropriate procedures and in particular through their representative institutions, whenever legislative or administrative measures are foreseen that may directly affect them; b) The establishment of the means by which interested peoples can participate freely, at least to the same extent as other sectors of the population, and at all levels in decision-making of elective institutions and administrative and other bodies responsible for policies and programs that concern them; c) The establishment of the means for the full development of the institutions and initiatives of these peoples, and the provision of the necessary resources for this purpose when appropriate; and d) The consultations held must be carried out in good faith and in a manner appropriate to the circumstances, with the aim of reaching an agreement or obtaining consent regarding the proposed measures.

VI

That the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples of 2007, in Article 18 states that indigenous peoples have the right to participate in decision-making on issues that affect their rights, through representatives chosen by them in accordance with their own procedures, as well as to maintain and develop their own decision-making institutions and in Article 19 it states that States shall consult and cooperate in good faith with the indigenous peoples concerned through their representative institutions before adopting and implementing legislative or administrative measures that affect them, in order to obtain their free, prior and informed consent

VIII

That That in accordance with Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008, Article 1 declares a Special Development Regime for the purpose of Executive Attention to the Indigenous Territories of Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu, and Kipla Sait Tasbaika, located in the Upper Wangki and Bokay Basins. Article 2 establishes that it is based on territorial governments, communal entities, and traditional forms of administration of the affairs and interests of the member communities. The Special Development Regime is administered by the Indigenous Territorial Government, which will be made up of the leader of each of the three indigenous territories, who will elect the leader of the Indigenous Territorial Government, to ensure compliance with the rights, duties and actions arising from the Special Regime.

IX

That in accordance with Article 3 of the aforementioned Decree, priority will be given to the promotion of plans, programs and projects related to productive activities, infrastructure, environmental protection, citizen security, education, health. The Ministries of State and Respective autonomous entities, must include in their respective Institutional Plans, the actions and the corresponding budget for all of the above within no more than 30 days from the publication of this decree.

That the execution of the plans, programs and projects to be implemented in these territories must be through the administration bodies of the Special Regime and the territorial and communal governments.

The representatives of the Territorial Assembly of the Kipla Saint Tasbaika Territory, consisting of 121 members, convened in the Yahbra Tangni Community of the Kipla Sait Tasbaika Territory located in the Alto Wangki and Bokay Basin, on August 24, 2023 with the objective of learning about and conducting Prior, Free and Informed consultation for the Consent for the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves, for an approximate period of four years (2023 - 2027), the 121 (one hundred and twenty-one) accredited representatives before the territorial assembly and authorities of the territorial government, the assembly began at 08:00 am i and ended at 4:30 pm

Attendance at the assembly was 162 people, of which 121 were assembly members of the GCI and the GTI-KST and the women's organization, 21 were from the UNOPS commission, WFP, 4 delegates were from the institutions in Alto Wangki and Bokay, 6 members were from the AWB regional team, and 10 members were from the National Police.

Of the total of 121 the quorum for attendance and approval of the consent must be 61. The quorum of the territorial assembly was verified, having 121 representatives from the territorial assembly with which the quorum was ratified to begin the consultation in a Prior, Free and Informed manner for Consent for the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project, of these 121 DGCI, 45 were women and 76 men.

The process was implemented by the Regional Government of upper Wangki and Bokay, through the Regional Coordinator, Cro. Primitivo Centeno and the members of the regional technical team, which was selected in consensus with the 3 territory presidents.

1.3. Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves

The Government of Reconciliation and National Unity managed and obtained financing from the Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI) for a total amount of US\$116.6 million for the Republic of Nicaragua for the execution of the Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves. The resources come from a loan from CABEI and a loan and donation from the Green Climate Fund (GFC), to contribute to combating climate change by reducing emissions caused by deforestation, forest degradation and livestock farming, as well as improving carbon reserves. Additionally, it will directly impact the most vulnerable population in the Nicaraguan Caribbean area, supporting adaptation and reducing the negative effects that climate change has on their livelihoods, and will also improve their standard of living by generating higher incomes. and more jobs.

The implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project is of great importance due to the serious damage caused by hurricanes Eta and Iota in Nicaragua and is estimated to benefit 665,821 inhabitants directly (51,100) and indirectly (614,721) on the Nicaraguan Caribbean Coast and the Alto Wangki and Bokay" through the establishment of sustainable production and forest management and reforestation models in an area that will cover an estimated 603,035 ha.

In general, Bio-CLIMA will increase its carbon absorption capacity by 14% in relation to the reference scenario for 2030, by promoting agroecological production of permanent crops under the shade of trees, which are more resistant to the impacts of climate change; reducing extensive grazing and introducing silvopastoral and cocoa agroforestry systems, establishing planted forests on idle or degraded forest lands; prioritizing the use of natural regeneration of native tree species; restoring and conserving ecosystems and ecosystem services, taking advantage of adaptation and mitigation synergies, with special emphasis on watershed management and risk reduction, including the conservation of biological diversity and protected areas.

The project has three components:

Component 1: Conserve and Produce for Life (Direct Investment in landscape restoration and reforestation)

Through this component, activities are focused on: (I) preparation of land and territory use/management plans, preparation of investment plans at the community level, productive development (livestock, cocoa) through the establishment of agroforestry and silvopastoral systems; as well as the promotion of ventures for sustainable forest management of timber and non-timber products; (ii) restoration of productive landscapes and reforestation in degraded areas (Indigenous Territories within the BOSAVVAS Reserve, the Indio Maíz Biological Reserve and its buffer zones and in twelve indigenous territories with the highest risk of deforestation.

Throughout Nicaragua, the indigenous peoples are the ones who conserve the forest, the defense of these forests is not something that we have been fighting for all our lives, we have been fighting to maintain the forests. In the Activities we carry out we must carefully analyze what to do with the settlers, who come to live in the territory and establish large areas of pasture. The Project is quite good and in line with our vision, we just need to clearly establish what activities to carry out.

3. Mr. Nacilio Miguel of the Comunidad de Arandak: I feel that it is a continuity of the ENDE-RED. I am talking about 3 major components and we must be clear that we need the 3 components, because currently we have forest degradation and we must update maps and address this need to recover the forest and I think that the other indigenous territorial governments must agree on ideas and work under a single line of action. We are here thinking about the good of the communities and we agree with the project.

4. Mrs. Marcela López Pérez of the Community: I take the floor to thank you for this opportunity to participate in this process and we are happy that we will have this project that will guarantee conservation.

5. Mrs. Marlene Prado Gamboa from the Linda Vista community: I appreciate that the government has not included in the project, for the first time we will be compensated for conserving our forests.

6. Jefry Colemer Devís Serapio: from the Raiti Community: I ask how we are going to conserve the forest because there are settlers who are reducing our forests.

7. Alonso Henry Suarez from the Tilba Lupia Community: The presentation of the project is good and we support the project. But we must be careful, as it is a big project. When we talk about a project many people come here from outside to benefit and most of the funds do not reach here. The objective of being here is to know what to do with the settlers, when the sanitation is going to take place, we cannot give the settlers rights, we must first expel the settlers and then accept the project.

8. Eduardo Flores from the Kiwhras Community: We are grateful to God, for giving us strength to be united, we are proud of the wealth that we have, we have fought for this land, first the war in the 80s, then we obtained the title and we have it secured, but today we are threatened, by deforestation. Now we can no longer hunt or fish and gather in the forests, we are being threatened, but the project envisages that it will benefit those who damaged the forest and we believe that that is not fair.

9. Mayolga Pérez from the Andristara Community: The presentation of the project is excellent. My attention is caught by the fact that we can produce and the project channels the market so that we can sell what we produce.

10. Mrs. Brelinda Cobán from the Tilba Lupza community: I am satisfied with the presentation of the project, it will support us in the regeneration of our forest.

11. Mrs. Nolvía Rosalío from the Raiti Community: Although there are some disagreements, I have listened carefully to the presentation and support the project. We are in danger of losing our forest and the good thing is that with this project we will be able to recover it. The good thing about the project is that it restores women's rights to participate and that they will benefit.

12. Mr. Nitario Muñoz of the Raiti Community: We are happy and this project is a dream we have always had. We must reorganize ourselves to be able to take care of the riches of our territory. The project includes protecting the forest, guaranteeing clean air, protecting water sources and for us it is an excellent project. We know that we are threatened by invading settlers but we are defending. Our ancestors conserved the forest and we are going to continue doing so. We have problems with the settlers and the MARENA allow it to be silent and hidden but when there is a project they do show up and want to execute the project. That is why we could even make the ministry responsible for the forests that we lose due to the deforestation of the settlers.

III PRIOR, FREE AND INFORMED CONSULTATION BY A SHOW OF HANDS AND SIGNATURES FOR CONSENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT

The consultation was held in the Miskitu language given that 16 of the 22 communities originally speak this language and the remaining 5 are Mayangana but perfectly understand Miskitu. Therefore, the 121 assembly members were asked to cast a vote by a show of hands in favor of the implementation of the project, obtaining 121 votes in favor; 0 votes against and 0 votes of abstention. In accordance with the required quorum, which is 61 votes in favor, the implementation of the BIO-CLIMA project was approved by the territorial assembly.

The assembly members were asked in accordance with the vote cast to sign the consent on the lists prepared for this purpose, obtaining 121 signatures that approved and gave consent for the implementation of the project, thus completing the quorum for the consent for its implementation; OR number of signatures that did not give their consent and OR signatures that abstained.

The participation of women was 45, which represents 37%.

The formation of the Assembly occurs with people representing different communities of the Kipla Sait Kasbaika Territory, where for each of these communities there were five people, in principle giving a total Assembly of 121 people. The consent vote reported 43 women and 70 men.

WOMEN:

- During the open moments for discussion of the project, the President of the Indigenous Territorial Government (GTI) invited women to speak, and six women out of a total of 14 people, spoke at the time of Open Dialogue.
- At the closing of the Assembly and before the vote, the Vice President of the GTI of KST thanked women for their participation. She said she was very happy that women had raised their voices. She affirmed that from that date on, women would be included in all discussions relating to the territory.
- A space was set up for children to spend the day drawing while their mothers were in the assembly.
- At the beginning of the Assembly, men occupied the front rows. Following the intervention of a person (a man), there was a change and women sat in the front rows.

COUNCIL OF ELDERS:

- There was a person who expressly identified himself as part of the Raití Council of Elders. But there were no other similar indications.

**There was no evidence of participation of people or organized groups of people with disabilities, LGBTIQ+ or sports, religious or youth groups.

6. Qualitative assessment, concerns or conflicts mentioned by the community

1. (From Yahbra Tagni community): What are the three territories to which the project refers?

A/ (GTI): RACCN, RACCS, Alto Wangki Bocay Special Zone/Region.

2. (Member of the KST Territory Management Board): It indicates that they expect compliance with the restoration of the forests by the Government of Nicaragua and by the BioClima project, and thanks the GTI for opening the spaces and for developing a consultation process for the FPIC .
3. (From the Kipla community): Request that it be a space to speak without restriction and without time limitations. Reaffirms support for the project, saying that if its territory had the necessary strength, the project would already be under way. Indicates that it needs to be started immediately. Expresses concerns about the influx of farmers and ranchers into Kipla, generating destruction and damage to the forest. Hopes that the project will help remove these non-indigenous people from their territories.
4. (From Kihuras community):
 - They reminded the assembly that in the past there had been other programmes to reduce emissions or pay for environmental services, but for various reasons they had stopped and they no longer received their benefits. So, their hope is that this project will be maintained throughout the planned time and will benefit them for many years.
 - Consult about the four months for implementing the FPIC .
 - They indicate that the map shown does not reflect the deforestation damage that the deep forest has suffered in the last eight years (since 2015). They mention that this destruction is the fault of the non-indigenous farmers and that they must leave Alto Wangki.
 - They comment that although they have doubts about the project, they will have a later meeting with the GTI to discuss some of these issues.
5. (From the KST women's organization / Rio Lakus Community): They expressed their gratitude and support for the project because it will allow the forests to be restored and they value the participation of women as important.
6. (From the KST women's organization/Arandak Community): They expressed to the Assembly that they celebrate the right that women now have to meet in these spaces and participate. "I am very grateful. I don't have a profession, but I do have a lot of knowledge." the speaker said.
7. (From the Raiti community):
 - Thanked UNOPS observers and government representatives for being in the territory of Kipla Sait Tasbaika.
 - They had a query: Specifically, how are people going to benefit from the BioClima project?
 - They mentioned that people who defend the territory and the forests are at risk of their lives. They spoke of three people who had died due to tensions related to protection).

A/ (GTI): For some time they have been improving coverage and now there are rangers in all sectors.

R/ (Ministry of the Environment and Natural Resources (MARENA)): BioClima protects Mother Earth and with this project there will be benefits from caring for the forest. BioClima is bigger than ENDE-REDD+.

8. (From the Tilba Lupia community): Expresses concerns about the problems and the means of delivering the money. They mention that they believe the benefits will remain in intermediate hands and will not reach the communities. They also express concerns that the project will increase the presence of non-indigenous people ("settlers") in the area, leading to greater forest and environmental destruction.
9. (From the Kiwrás community): They express concern about the very rapid destruction of the forest by non-indigenous people from outside the territory. They propose orally (without motion or written proposal) to the Assembly that the project should be evaluated part by part.

*The President of the GTI admonished the speaker who expressed criticism of the project saying that he should not talk about topics other than BioClima.

10. (From the KST women's organization / Andris Tara Community): They expressed their support for the project and said they appreciated the invitation to participate.
11. (From the KST women's organization / Tilba Lupia Community): They indicated that they hoped the project would mention bringing school to the community. They thanked the organizers and expressed their wish that the project be carried out; the issue of reforestation was very important, because the forest was their means of livelihood.
12. (From the KST women's organization / Tilba Lupia Community): They thanked the GTI for the activity and for the support that it seemed they were giving to BioClima.
13. (From the KST women's organization / Raití Community): They hoped that the destruction of the river would be reversed and an improvement in crops would be achieved, although they recognized that deforestation was more present on the Honduran than on the Nicaragua side. They mentioned that previously there was little participation of women and that was changing very significantly. They hoped the participation of women in the project would be reality and not just a plan.
14. (From the Council of Elders / Community of Raití): They saw this as an important discussion in which all sectors and groups of the community must be involved. They reaffirmed the need for environmental protection and the danger that people suffer for taking care of their lands in the face of non-indigenous people/settlers. They said this lack of protection was the fault of MARENA (Ministry of the Environment and Natural Resources) and the Government.

**The President of the GTI again admonished the speaker criticizing the project, saying that he should not talk about topics other than BioClima.

A/ (GTI): In response to the comment on the entry of non-indigenous people into the territory, it was stated that component No. 2 of the project: Good Governance is about that, about organizing the institutions and removing those people they call settlers from AWB.

R/ (Ministry of the Environment and Natural Resources (MARENA)): "We take note of what was expressed and continue working alongside the police and the army. Thank you".

Components of the sheet:

3. Principles for FPIC development

- **Reasonable term:** No, because there is little time between the presentation of the project, its evaluation and discussion (in an assembly on the same day) and the submission of consent to a vote.
- **Timely information:** Not entirely, because the ways of disseminating knowledge started from a printed presentation written in Spanish.

7. Lessons learned / recommendations / areas for improvement

Differentiate in this space recommendations and areas of improvement for:

- **The organizing institutions of FPIC and MC**
 - It is advisable to establish a general consultation mechanism that, from the world view of each People and Territory, in its autonomy and self-regulation, establishes basic guidelines for the protection of the principles of free, prior and informed consultation.
 - It is necessary to ensure translation into the three languages (Spanish, Miskito, Mayangna), at all times and for all the people who need it (even if they are a "minority").
 - It is recommended that there be more time to understand the project before the decision-making and voting in the consultation phase (to which this document refers).
 - **For greater freedom - as a principle of FPIC - during the voting process, a mechanism is recommended to ensure people's secret vote - instead of a public one by show of hands - (which is also recorded by photographs as people vote).) .**
 - *For democratic balance, the practice of requiring only those who are 'against' the proposal to indicate this in the plenary session should be discouraged.*
 - It is important for security forces (police and army) not to be present in the discussion and voting area (for consent) during an indigenous consultation.
- **United Nations (UNOPS/WFP)**
 - It is recommended that emphasis continue to be given to the roles of UNOPS as observer and of WFP as logistical support, so as not to give participants the impression that these two agencies are responsible for the process.
 - It is recommended that it be further clarified that UNOPS is not in charge of the execution of the project, so that there is no confusion among the population consulted.

CONSIDERATIONS

I

That the State recognizes the existence of indigenous and Afro-descendant peoples who enjoy the rights, duties and guarantees established in the Constitution and, especially, those of maintaining and developing their identity and culture, having their own forms of social organization and managing their local affairs; as well as maintaining the communal forms of ownership of their lands and the enjoyment, use and enjoyment, all in accordance with the Law.

II

That the National Assembly approved on January 23, 2003, Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, and that in accordance with Article 2. Among the specific objectives are: To regulate the communal property, use and management rights of natural resources in the traditional communal lands of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities; to determine the legal procedures necessary for this recognition, taking into account the full participation of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, through their traditional authorities. Additionally, to establish the fundamental principles of the administrative regime for indigenous peoples and ethnic communities in the management of their communal territories.

III

In accordance with Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Chapter II defines the Communal Authorities and Territorials with Legal representation in Articles. 4 and 5.

IV

That the aforementioned law states that the Communal Assembly constitutes the highest authority of the indigenous and ethnic communities. The communal authorities represent the communities legally. Each community will decide which communal authority legally represents it. The Territorial Assembly is the highest authority of the territory and is convened according to the procedures established by the group of communities that make up the territorial unit. Communal authorities are traditional administration and government bodies that represent the communities that elect them according to their customs and traditions. Territorial authorities are administrative bodies of the territorial unit which they legally represent.

V

That on May 6, 2010, the National Assembly of Nicaragua approved Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, which requires among other points in Article 6: a. The consultation of the interested peoples, through appropriate procedures and in particular through their representative institutions, whenever legislative or administrative measures are foreseen that may directly affect them; b) The establishment of the means by which interested peoples can participate freely, at least to the same extent as other sectors of the population, and at all levels in decision-making of elective institutions and administrative and other bodies responsible for policies and programs that concern them; c) The establishment of the means for the full development of the institutions and initiatives of these peoples, and the provision of the necessary resources for this purpose when appropriate; and d) The consultations held must be carried out in good faith and in a manner appropriate to the circumstances, with the aim of reaching an agreement or obtaining consent regarding the proposed measures.

VI

That the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples of 2007, in Article 18 states that indigenous peoples have the right to participate in decision-making on issues that affect their rights, through representatives chosen by them in accordance with their own procedures, as well as to maintain and develop their own decision-making institutions and in Article 19 it states that States shall consult and cooperate in good faith with the indigenous peoples concerned through their representative institutions before adopting and implementing legislative or administrative measures that affect them, in order to obtain their free, prior and informed consent

That in accordance with Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008, Article 1 declares a Special Development Regime for the purpose of Executive Attention to the Indigenous Territories of Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu, and Kipla Sait Tasbaika, located in the Upper Wangki and Bokay Basins. Article 2 establishes that it is based on territorial governments, communal entities, and traditional forms of administration of the affairs and interests of the member communities. The Special Development Regime is administered by the Indigenous Territorial Government, which will be made up of the leader of each of the three indigenous territories, who will elect the leader of the Indigenous Territorial Government, to ensure compliance with the rights, duties and actions arising from the Special Regime.

IX

That in accordance with Article 3 of the aforementioned Decree, priority will be given to the promotion of plans, programs and projects related to productive activities, infrastructure, environmental protection, citizen security, education, health. The Ministries of State and Respective autonomous entities, must include in their respective Institutional Plans, the actions and the corresponding budget for all of the above within no more than 30 days from the publication of this decree.

That the execution of the plans, programs and projects to be implemented in these territories must be through the administration bodies of the Special Regime and the territorial and communal governments.

The methodology is based on the principles of traditional norms of indigenous peoples such as common good, collectivity, sharing, good faith, timely information, transparency, interculturality, self-determination, distribution of benefits, flexibility, equity and equality.

1.3. Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves

The Government of Reconciliation and National Unity managed and obtained financing from the Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI) for a total amount of US\$116.6 million for the Republic of Nicaragua for the execution of the Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and San Juan River Biosphere Reserves. The resources come from a loan from CABEI and a loan and donation from the Green Climate Fund (GFC), to contribute to combating climate change by reducing emissions caused by deforestation, forest degradation and livestock farming, as well as improving carbon reserves. Additionally, it will directly impact the most vulnerable population in the Nicaraguan Caribbean area, supporting adaptation and reducing the negative effects that climate change has on their livelihoods, and will also improve their standard of living by generating higher incomes. and more jobs.

The implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project has great relevance due to the serious damage caused by hurricanes Eta and Iota in Nicaragua and is estimated to benefit 665,821 inhabitants directly (51,100) and indirectly (614, 721) on the Nicaraguan Caribbean Coast and the Upper Wangki and Bokay" through the establishment of sustainable production models and forest management and reforestation in an area that will cover an estimated 603,035 hectares.

5. Mr. Jessenia Rizo of the Nawawas Community: The Project is very good because it talks about conserving the forest and what is best for us, it also talks about strengthening the GTI, and the women's organization and we appreciate that there is this commitment.

6. Mrs. Asucena Dixon from the Amak Community: We are not here to talk about the organizations, we are seeing the presentation of a project and for us it is good to know that it has components that prioritize the gender aspect and we hope through the project we will get answers to our demands.

7. Mr. Jeremiah of the Brikputwas Community: Not being able to talk about the GTI at this moment, we are happy about this project and we would like its execution to begin. A long time has passed without projects. We are sure that this project will strengthen the communities so that we can continue defending our territory and ensuring conservation. We as a territory have not had the capacity to secure and take care of the land due to lack of projects. We are pleased that this project considers aspects of strengthening governance because that is essential to be able to defend our territory.

13. Mr. Rigoberto Palaces of the Kudawas Community: We have not had a project like this because it aims to ensure conservation and that is life for our communities. We cannot let this project fail because it means that we will never overcome our weakness. We support the presentation of the project and we want it to be executed in our communities.

III PRIOR, FREE AND INFORMED CONSULTATION BY A SHOW OF HANDS AND SIGNATURES FOR CONSENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT

The consultation was held in the Mayangna language given that 22 communities originally speak this language, therefore, the 127 assembly members were asked to cast a vote by a show of hands in favor of the implementation of the project, obtaining 127 votes in favor; 0 votes against and 0 votes of abstention. In accordance with the required quorum, which is 65 votes in favor, the implementation of the BIO-CLIMA project was approved by the territorial assembly.

The formation of the Assembly occurs with people representing different communities of the Mayangna Sauni Bu Territory, where for each of these communities there were five people, in principle giving a total Assembly of 127 people. The consent vote reported 45 women and 82 men.

WOMEN:

- In the opening space of the consultation, approved by the Assembly on the agenda, a woman gave the welcoming address. The moderators and other male participants also expressed on several occasions how important and stimulating it was to have women participating.
- There were 14 comments or questions from people in the open dialogue space, exactly half of them (seven) from women.

COUNCIL OF ELDERS:

- Of the 14 interventions, one was by a man who identified himself as a member of the Council of Elders.

**There was no evidence of participation of people or organized groups of people with disabilities, LGBTIQ+ or sports, religious or youth groups.

6. Qualitative assessment, concerns or conflicts mentioned by the community

1. (From Tahawas community and Council of Elders): They indicated that they use a preservation approach, but are weak on ancestral knowledge, which is why they hope that the BioClima project will bring real benefits to the community. Before, the leaders did not take them into account and now with this project it seems that they do. They asked what indigenous leaders were doing to maintain the projects and to send resources to the communities. They said they wanted to know what they were really going to do.
2. (From the Amak community and communal judge): "There are many projects that have been presented to the community with certain characteristics, but once they start, they become something else or are not

executed according to their plan." "They deceive us, in the community we do not see the benefits."

3. (From the Whina community and women's organization):
 - a. They say they do not understand what is the path and horizon of the project. "We hope that they do not deceive us once again, and are offering us a candy that is a lie."
 - b. "We don't understand, are we going to plant trees for the settlers?"
 - c. There are problems of land invasion, they come to the territories and make promises, but they are not kept. You (in reference to people from the Government and donors) like being in Managua.
4. (From the Winawás community and women's organization): If from the beginning the leaders had worked like this (in advance and trying to join forces), the lands would not have been lost. The project sounds good, but we don't know how real it is. The project is very good, but it is important to say that we have problems with conflicts over land possession. We may accept the project and then not see the results. We prefer to resolve internal problems before accepting the project.
5. (From the Walawás community and communal judge): We suffer problems and they do not attend to us. The authorities are weak, the government has not worked well to protect the territory. Young people must take the lead. We need humanitarian aid and support with seeds (for planting).
6. (From the Kayayawás community and women's organization): We do not demand that everything be perfect from the authorities, but we do want to ask them to work hard and do it well. The women's organization has not been supported, they have not taken us into account and we are happy because this project for the first time will support the women's organization.
7. (From the MSB Territory women's organization): As the MSB women's organization, we ask no to be left aside, to be taken into account. We support the communities a lot, we have worked with small projects and we have worked well.
8. (From the Brikput Was community): We are grateful for the new leaders this year; the territorial leaders did not take into account the communal leaders until this year; this project will support health, studies, the women's association and we are happy, - how can we not be if many good things come - they also presented the fund and it is enough and we must support as territorials also so that we work better. MARENA also has to support more.
9. (Woman): "I don't have much to say, the project is interesting, there is nothing to fear, there are many good things, focus on satisfying the needs of women."
10. (From the community of Peñas Blancas): We (indigenous people) should not sell the lands, because that generates displacement of people. Reaffirm the need for support.
11. (From the Whina community): Wait for further analysis and information on the benefits. Respect the work of the Government.

12. (From the Tahauwas community): "I am very happy for the first time we are hearing about this project that is coming, that will reforest and provide a lot of jobs, the majority are selling land; we want this project to come so we stop selling the land, improve our reserves. As a woman I am happy and I want it to come, because it is very important to all of us - most of us have problems with the settler invasion."
13. (From the Tahawas community and women's organization): There are land and agricultural production problems. The area is affected by the sale of land to non-indigenous people; government is supporting us with this project, to save and protect the resources of the community. Happy because they didn't have that interaction/meeting before, and now they do. Let's focus on the themes of the project. Super interesting project, it will benefit us and our children.
14. (From the Nahuawas community): Thank you for the presentation and remember that three years ago there was a presentation to the community about the ENDE-REDD+ project. As a community we can now start planting and make progress in reforesting what we have lost.

Components of the sheet:

3. Principles for FPIC development

- **Reasonable term:** No, because there is little time between the presentation of the project, its evaluation and discussion (in an assembly on the same day) and the submission of consent to a vote.
- **Timely information:** Not entirely, because the ways of disseminating knowledge started from a printed presentation written in Spanish, with an explanation in Spanish, which was later translated into Mayangna. This procedure was not efficient in providing optimal understanding for people, above all because the translator went deeper into the explanation than the writer himself (according to the BICU translating and reporting criteria), demonstrating throughout the session that he was able to make a presentation attached to reality and what was defined in the text to be consulted.

7. Lessons learned / recommendations / areas for improvement

Differentiate in this space recommendations and areas of improvement for:

- **The organizing institutions of FPIC and MC**
 - It is advisable to establish a general consultation mechanism that, from the world view of each People and Territory, in its autonomy and self-regulation, establishes basic guidelines for the protection of the principles of free, prior and informed consultation.
 - It is necessary to ensure translation into the three languages (Spanish, Miskito, Mayangna), at all times and for all the people who need it (even if they are a "minority").
 - It is recommended that there be more time to understand the project before the decision-making and voting in the consultation phase (to which this document refers).
 - **For greater freedom - as a principle of FPIC - during the voting process, a mechanism is recommended to ensure people's secret vote - instead of a public one by show of hands - (which is also recorded by photographs as people vote) .**

- *For democratic balance, the practice of requiring only those who are 'against' the proposal to indicate this in the plenary session should be discouraged.*
 - It is recommended to use the word “vote” when calling for a decision on the proposal, rather than referring to “approval.”
 - It is important for security forces (police and army) not to be present in the discussion and voting area (for consent) during an indigenous consultation.
 - It is best practice for the presentation of the proposal to be consulted on to be done directly in the language of the population to be consulted, in this case in Mayangna. The above, because the presentation was made in Spanish, and then translated into Mayangna. As a result, the many technical and linguistic intermediate steps affect the integral transfer of information from the base project to the recipients and people consulted. In addition to unnecessarily expanding the space and time, causing fatigue to participants.
 - It is recommended to investigate in greater depth and pay special attention to the relationship between payment of travel expenses and participation. This because in several instances people stated that this was a payment made by the GTI for them to participate (as opposed to complementarities of their travel and food expenses). Although it was publicly expressed as logistical support managed by WFP, this relationship between exhibitor-consultant and payment for participation may weaken the freedom with which people participate and their right to oppose people who present projects for their consent.
 - We recommend greater appropriation of the content of the BioClima presentation by the facilitators, who in many cases repeated themselves and were ignorant of some terminology and abbreviations.
- **United Nations (UNOPS/WFP)**
 - It is recommended that emphasis continue to be given to the roles of UNOPS as observer and of WFP as logistical support, so as not to give participants the impression that these two agencies are responsible for the process.
 - It is recommended that it be further clarified that UNOPS is not in charge of the execution of the project, so that there is no confusion among the population consulted.

**MINUTES OF THE TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY OF THE MISKITU INDIAN TASBAIKA
KUM TERRITORY HELD IN THE COMMUNITY OF SAN ANDRÉS, ON THE FREE,
PRIOR AND INFORMED CONSULTATION FOR CONSENT IN THE

CONSIDERING

I

That the State recognizes the existence of indigenous and Afro-descendant peoples, who enjoy the rights, duties and guarantees set forth in the Constitution and, especially, those of maintaining and developing their identity and culture, having their own forms of social organization and managing their local affairs; as well as maintaining the communal forms of ownership of their lands and the enjoyment, use and benefit, all in accordance with the Law.

II

That on January 23, 2003, the National Assembly approved Law 445 on the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Caribbean Coast of Nicaragua and of the Rivers Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maiz Law, and that in accordance with Article 2. among the specific objectives are: to regulate rights of communal property, use and administration of natural resources on the traditional communal lands of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities; determine the legal procedures necessary for said recognition, considering the full participation of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, through their traditional authorities and, among others, establish the fundamental principles of the administrative regime of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, in the management of their communal territories.

III

That in accordance with Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Caribbean Coast of Nicaragua and of the Rivers Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maiz, Chapter II of which determines the Communal Authorities and Territorials with Legal representation in the Articles. 4 and 5.

IV

That the aforementioned law establishes that the Communal Assembly is the highest authority of the indigenous and ethnic communities. The legal representation of the communities corresponds to the communal authorities. Each community will define which communal authority legally represents it. The Territorial Assembly is the highest authority of the territory and is convened according to the procedures established by the group of communities that make up the territorial unit. Communal authorities are traditional administration and government bodies that represent the communities that elect them according to their customs and traditions. Territorial authorities are administrative bodies of the territorial unit which they legally represent.

V

On May 6, 2010, the National Assembly of Nicaragua approved Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, whose Article 6 establishes, among others a. consult the peoples concerned, through appropriate procedures and in particular through their representative institutions, whenever consideration is being given to legislative or administrative measures which may affect them directly; b) establish means by which these peoples can freely participate, to at least the same extent as other sectors of the population, at all levels of decision-making in elective institutions and administrative and other bodies responsible for policies and programs which concern them; c) establish means for the full development of these peoples' own institutions and initiatives, and in appropriate cases provide the resources necessary for this purpose; and d) consultations must be carried out in good faith and in a manner appropriate to the circumstances, with the aim of achieving agreement or consent to the proposed measures.

VI

Article 18 of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous and Peoples of African Descent of 2007 states that indigenous peoples have the right to participate in decision-making in matters which would affect their rights, through representatives chosen by themselves in accordance with their own procedures, as well as to maintain and develop their own indigenous decision-making institutions and in Article 19 says that States shall consult and cooperate in good faith with the indigenous peoples concerned through their own representative institutions in order to obtain their free, prior and informed consent before adopting and implementing legislative or administrative

measures that may affect them.

VIII

In accordance with Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008 in Article 1, declares the Special Regime of Development for Executive Assistance to the Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu and Kipla Sait Tasbaika in the Alto Wangki and Bokay Basin, whose Article 2, establishes that it is based on territorial and communal governments and traditional forms of administration of the affairs and interests of the member communities. For its administration, the Special Development Regime will be in charge of the Indigenous Territorial Government, which will comprise the head of each of the three indigenous territories, and from among them they will elect the head of the Indigenous Territorial Government to ensure compliance with the rights, duties and actions derived from the Special Regime.

IX

In accordance with Article 3 of the aforementioned Decree, priority will be given to the promotion of plans, programs and projects for the production, infrastructure, environmental protection, citizen security, education, health, for which the Ministries of State and respective autonomous entities, include their respective Institutional Plans, actions and the corresponding budget, all of the above within a period of no more than 30 days from the publication of this decree.

The execution of the plans, programs and projects to be implemented in these territories must be through the administration bodies of the Special Regime and the territorial and communal governments.

A total of **235** people attended the assembly of whom **192** were assembly members of the indigenous Communal Governments, the Indigenous Territorial Government of **Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum**, the women's organization (WIMPA), **21** of the UNOPS commission, PMA, **4** delegates from the institutions present in the Alto Wangki and Bokay, 6 members of the AWB regional team, **2** special guests and **10** members of the National Police.

The total of **192** The quorum for attendance and approval of consent must be **97** The quorum of the territorial assembly was verified, considering the **192** representatives of the territorial assembly with which the quorum was ratified to begin the consultation in a Free, Prior and Informed manner to Consent to the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project, of these **192** Delegates of the Indigenous Communal Governments, **53** of them were women and **139** were men.

The process was implemented by the Regional Government of Alto Wangki and Bokay, through the Regional Coordinator, Cro. Primitivo Centeno and the members of the regional technical team, which was selected in consensus with the three territorial

2. On July 4 and 5, job assignment, at the Marena-Managua Offices.
3. Three-day work session in the month of August 2023, at the CABEL offices.
4. On August 8, 2023 meeting at the PMA, to confirm the budget to be executed within the framework of the application of the FPIC.

Next, extensive, detailed information was provided about the Free, Prior and Informed Consultation process and the Bio-CLIMA Project to obtain consent for the project in question.

1.2. Applied Methodology for the Free, Prior, Informed Consultation Process to obtain Consent

The methodology applied in the process of Free, Prior and Informed Consultation to obtain consent for the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project has been governed by the traditional processes of the communities and territories and in accordance with the Political Constitution of the Republic of Nicaragua , Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Caribbean Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008 in Article 1, declares in Special Development Regime for the purposes of Executive Assistance to the Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum,

Mayangna Sauni Bu and Kipla Sait Tasbaika Indigenous Territories, located in the Alto Wangki and Bokay Basin, Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, among other standards.

The methodology is based on the principles of traditional norms of indigenous peoples such as the common good, collectivity, sharing, good faith, timely information, transparency, interculturality, self-determination, distribution of benefits, flexibility, equity and equality.

1.3. Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in Bosawás and Rio San Juan Biospheres.

The Government of Reconciliation and National Unity managed and obtained financing from the Banco de Integración Económica (BCIE) for a total amount of US\$116.6 million to the Republic of Nicaragua to carry out the Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in Bosawás and Rio San Juan Biospheres and that the resources come from a loan from CABEI and a loan and donation from the Green Climate Fund (GCF), to combat climate change by reducing emissions caused by deforestation, forest degradation and livestock farming, as well as improving carbon stocks. Likewise, it will directly impact the most vulnerable population in the Nicaraguan Caribbean area, supporting adaptation and reducing the negative effects of climate change on their livelihoods, and will also improve their standard of living by generating higher incomes and more jobs.

The implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project is extremely relevant due to the serious damage caused by hurricanes Eta and Iota in Nicaragua and is estimated to benefit 665,821 inhabitants directly (51,100) and indirectly (614,721) on the North Caribbean Coast of Nicaragua" by establishing sustainable production and management and reforestation models forests in an area that will cover an estimated 603,035 hectares.

Overall, Bio-CLIMA will increase its carbon absorption capacity by 14% in relation to the reference scenario for 2030, by promoting agroecological production of permanent crops under the shade of trees, more resistant to the impact of climate change; reducing extensive grazing and introducing silvopasture and cocoa agroforestry systems, establishing forest plantations on fallow and degraded forest lands; prioritizing the use of natural regeneration of native tree species; restoring and conserving ecosystems and ecosystem services, taking advantage of adaptation and mitigation synergies, with special emphasis on watershed management

and risk reduction, such as the conservation of biological diversity and protected areas.

The project has three components:

Component 1: Conserve and Produce for Life (Direct Investment in landscape restoration and reforestation)

Through this component, activities focused on the following will be financed: (i) preparation of land and territory use/management plans, preparation of investment plans at the community level, productive development (livestock, cocoa) through the establishment of agroforestry and silvopasture systems; as well as the promotion of ventures for sustainable forest management of timber and non-timber products; (ii) activities to restore productive landscapes and reforestation in degraded areas (Indigenous Territories within the BOSAWAS Reserve, the Indio Maíz Biological Reserve and its buffer zones and twelve indigenous territories with the highest risk of deforestation).

Component 2: Good Governance

This component has the purpose of financing activities focused on guaranteeing compliance with current regulations, standards and legislation regarding forest management, land use and environmental actions to preserve and conserve the Caribbean Region. The interventions aim to create a regulatory and governance environment by paving the way to transform extensive and destructive forms of land use into sustainable, climate-resilient practices especially targeting smallholders and households vulnerable to deforestation.

Component 3: Capacity Development

The component will finance activities focused on promoting training and capacity development. The technical staff of public services, producers and beneficiaries will be trained in the management and integrated planning of land use (PDT, POF), implementation and maintenance of productive models of landscape restoration, investment and business plans, innovations in administrative processes, legislation and standards, strengthening of local organizations, quality management and access to markets.

2. **Mrs. Felicita Méndez from the Shiminka Community:** We thank God for this opportunity to be here sharing this information that makes us aware of the project, we are going to approve this project because it means improving the future of our children, as mothers we want our children to have better opportunities and we are happy about the inclusion of the woman.
3. **Mr. Celestino Ocampo from the Ulwaswing 1 Community:** Today we have met to approve a project that guarantees a better future for future generations, the dream of having a project to conserve the forest and strengthen the communities for many years. Thank God, the project includes points that respond to our demands.
4. **Mr. Ornar Talavera of the Mukuwas Community:** All of us meeting here are adults and we know the importance of the approaches found in the project. We have an idea of so many things that happen around the world, we see diseases, natural disasters, but in our area the impact of these phenomena for the forest we have, we want the project to be carried out now and to support us to continue conserving territorial issues. It is necessary to create intercommunal lanes for adequate management and we must stop the sale of land to secure our forests.

The consultation was carried out in the Miskitu language since the **35** communities originally speak this language, therefore, they asked the **192 assembly members** to vote by a show of hands in favor of the implementation of the project, obtaining **192** votes in favor; **0** votes against and **0** abstentions. In accordance with the required quorum which is **97** votes in favor, the implementation of the BIO-CLIMA project is approved by the territorial assembly.

In accordance with the vote cast, the assembly members were asked to sign their consent on the lists prepared for this purpose, obtaining **192** signatures that approved and gave consent for the implementation of the project, thereby completing the quorum for consent for its implementation; **0** number of signatures that did not give their consent and **0** signatures that abstained.

A total of **53** women participated, accounting for **28%**.

**IV AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BIO
CLIMA PROJECT**

Once the consent is approved, the legal representative of the **Miskitu Territory Indian Tasbaika Kum** is authorized to carry out the corresponding procedures and sign an agreement related to the Bio-CLIMA Project, as appropriate.

V PLANNING, MONITORING AND INFORMATION

The Territorial Government of **Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum** will be responsible for ensuring compliance with the planning and will carry out the corresponding follow-up, and must keep the territorial assembly informed at least semiannually in accordance with traditional mechanisms.

The Assembly was composed of people representing different communities of the Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum Territory. The Assembly had a total of 192 people. The consent vote numbered 53 women (28% of the Assembly) and 139 men (72% of the Assembly).

WOMEN:

- In the opening space of the consultation, approved by the Assembly on the agenda, a woman gave the welcoming address.
- There were four comments or questions from people in the open dialogue space, half of them (two) from women.
- In general, there was little participation in the plenary session of the Assembly, so there was no active participation on the part of women in the open dialogue spaces.

*There was no evidence - from oral remarks - of participation of people or organized groups of Councils of Elderly, people with disabilities, LGBTIQ+ or sports, religious or youth groups.

**Among the participants (Assembly Members) there was one speaker with disabilities.

6. Qualitative assessment, concerns or conflicts mentioned by the community (Max. 1,000 words)

1. (Woman - From the community of San Andrés de Bocay). "From the beginning we have been listening and we have reached the final part of the presentation. Everything that has been discussed during the presentation remains as information. I would be happy if this is done as stated, if it doesn't end up getting lost just in words; It would be very good if it were implemented in each territory, since we know there are many poor people who need this project."
2. (Woman - From the Shiminka community). "There are many people here, but the majority are older and we have few young people. Now that we have our leader whom we chose, he brings this project with its complicated names, but I'm happy that this is for our children as beneficiaries, and that we women are taken into account within this project. In the morning, the day of cultural presentations of traditional Miskito dances, the presentation of the project and everything, God bless you. Let what was said today be done; as it has been planned, let it not be lost."

3. (Man - Ranger - From the Ulwas Kim community) “I thank our representatives, our leader Primitivo Centeno and our government authorities. Our region has been marginalized and our lands have been taken from us, I am happy to be able to benefit from this project, I speak on behalf of the three territories.”

4. (Man - Forest Ranger - From the community of Mucuas) “I support everything our leader spoke about, he went out to look for answers to the needs of our territory, and managed this project. We are waging a long struggle, that is why we are different from the big countries where the problems that have been occurring with diseases do not affect us as much as we are inside the forest and the air we breathe is not polluted. We have large forests that we need to live in, but land has been sold in various areas. The three territories are being affected, that is why we need our leader managing, to stop the “settlers” who have been getting involved as “parasites” and we need to stop that.

*It is observed that during the open dialogue space a person -who had orally expressed concerns about the project prior to the Assembly - asked to speak but the President of the GTI, who was present as moderator, refused to allow him to do so. It is not possible to identify whether this action responds to a deliberate act or to not seeing him. However, due to the size of the room and the location of the participating moderator/assembly member, anyone raising a hand for permission to speak is clearly visible.

**Based on the foregoing, interventions by participants in this Assembly were not exhausted and

***No space was taken to record votes in favor, against or abstentions. The only indication was that the proposal was to be ratified, people stand up, raise their hands and the moderator indicates that it was approved unanimously.

Components of the sheet:

3. Principles for the development of FPIC:

- **Reasonable term:** No, because there is little time between the presentation of the project, its evaluation and discussion (in an assembly on the same day) and the submission of consent to a vote.
- **Timely information:** Not entirely, because the ways of disseminating knowledge started from a printed presentation written in Spanish, with an explanation in Miskito. Without the possibility for the participants to access other sources of basic information or the root of the project, the printed form delivered or the oral explanation being their only source of information on which to base an immediate decision.

5. Diversity, Gender and Inclusion:

- In general, there was little participation in the plenary session of the Assembly, so there was no active participation on the part of women in the open dialogue spaces.

7. Lessons learned / recommendations / areas for improvement (Max 1,000 words)

Differentiate in this space recommendations and areas of improvement for:

- **The organizing institutions of FPIC and MC**
 - It is advisable to establish a general consultation mechanism that, from the world view of each People and Territory, in its autonomy and self-regulation, establishes basic guidelines for the protection of the principles of free, prior and informed consultation.
 - It is recommended that there be more time to understand the project before the decision-making and voting in the consultation phase (to which this document refers).
 - **For greater freedom - as a principle of FPIC - during the voting process, a mechanism is recommended to ensure people's secret vote - instead of a public one by show of hands - (which is also recorded by photographs as people vote).) .**
 - *For democratic balance, the practice of requiring only those who are 'against' the proposal to indicate this in the plenary session should be discouraged.*
 - It is recommended to use the word "vote" when calling for a decision on the proposal, rather than referring to "approval."
 - It is important for security forces (police and army) not to be present in the discussion and voting area (for consent) during an indigenous consultation.
 - It is recommended to investigate in greater depth and pay special attention to the relationship between payment of travel expenses and participation. This because in several instances people stated that this was a payment made by the GTI for them to participate (as opposed to complementarities of their travel and food expenses). Although it was publicly expressed as logistical support managed by WFP, this relationship between exhibitor-consultant and payment for participation may weaken the freedom with which people participate and their right to oppose people who present projects for their consent.
 - We recommend greater appropriation of the content of the BioClima presentation by the facilitators, who in many cases repeated themselves and were ignorant of some terminology and abbreviations.
 - The venues for holding the Assemblies for consultation on the FPIC must consider the best conditions for people's stay, or failing that, look for elements of environmental adaptation for issues such as ventilation, heat, hydration. It has been reiterated in the Assemblies of this territory, that the high temperatures significantly affected the full attention of the participating assembly members.

- **United Nations (UNOPS/WFP)**
 - It is recommended that emphasis continue to be given to the roles of UNOPS as observer and of WFP as logistical support, so as not to give participants the impression that these two agencies are responsible for the process.
 - It is recommended to reinforce the clarification that UNOPS is not in charge of the execution of the project, so that there is no confusion among the population consulted.

RECITALS

I

Whereas the State recognizes the existence of indigenous and Afro-descendant peoples, who enjoy the rights, duties and guarantees set forth in the Constitution and, especially, those of maintaining and developing their identity and culture, having their own forms of social organization and managing their local affairs; as well as maintaining the communal forms of ownership of their lands and the enjoyment, use and enjoyment, all in accordance with the Law.

II

Whereas the National Assembly approved on January 23, 2003, Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and of the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, and that in accordance with Article 2, among the specific objectives are: To regulate community property rights, use, and management of natural resources in the traditional communal lands of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities; to determine the legal procedures necessary for such recognition, taking into account the full interest of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, through their traditional authorities; and, among other things, to establish the basic principles of the administrative system of indigenous peoples and ethnic communities, in the management of their communal territories.

That, in accordance with Law 445 on the Regulation of Communal Property of Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, in Chapter II, the municipal and territorial authorities with legal representation are designated in Articles 4 and 5.

IV

That the aforementioned law establishes that the Communal Assembly constitutes the highest authority of the indigenous and ethnic communities. The legal representation of the communities is the responsibility of the communal authorities. Each community will determine which communal authority legally represents it. The Territorial Assembly is the highest authority of the territory and is convened according to the procedures established by the group of communities that constitute the territorial unit. Communal authorities are administrative and traditional governmental bodies that represent the communities that elect them, according to their customs and traditions. Territorial authorities are administrative bodies of the territorial unit which they legally represent.

V

Whereas on May 6, 2010, the National Assembly of Nicaragua approved Decree AN 5934 ratifying ILO Convention 169, which provides, among other things, in Article 6: a. Consult affected peoples through appropriate procedures, and in particular through their representative institutions, when legislative or administrative measures are planned that may directly affect them; b. Provide the means by which affected peoples may participate freely, at least to the same extent as other segments of the population, and at all levels in decision-making in electoral institutions and in administrative and other bodies responsible for policies and programs that affect them; (c) to provide the means for the full development of the institutions and initiatives of these peoples and, in appropriate cases, to allocate the necessary resources for this purpose; and (d) the consultations carried out must be conducted in good faith and in a manner appropriate to the circumstances, with a view to reaching agreement or obtaining approval for the proposed measures.

VI

That the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples of 2007, in Article 18 indicates that indigenous peoples have the right to participate in the adoption of their own decision-making institutions and in Article 19 indicates that States shall consult and cooperate in good faith with the indigenous peoples concerned through their representative institutions before adopting and implementing legislative or administrative measures that affect them, in order to obtain their free, prior and informed consent

In accordance with Decree No. 19-2008, adopted on April 14, 2008, it declares in Article 1 the Special Development Regime for the purposes of the Executive Branch for the indigenous territories of the Miskitu Indians Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu, and Kipla Sait Tasbaika, located in the Upper Wangki and Bokay Basins, and stipulates in Article 2 that it is based on territorial, communal governments and traditional forms of administration of the affairs and interests of the member communities. The administration of the Special Development Regime is the responsibility of the Indigenous Territorial Government, formed by the heads of the three indigenous territories. These elect from among themselves the head of the Indigenous Territorial Government, who ensures the observance of the rights, duties and measures arising from the Special Regime.

IX

Pursuant to Article 3 of the aforesaid Decree, priority shall be given to the promotion of plans, programs and projects in the areas of production, infrastructure, environmental protection, citizen security, education and health, for which the respective State Ministries and Autonomous Units shall be instructed to provide for the corresponding measures and budget in their respective institutional plans within a period not exceeding 30 days from the publication of this Decree.

That the execution of the plans, programs and projects to be implemented in these territories shall be carried out by the administration of the Special Regime and the territorial and communal governments.

The methodology applied in the consultation for free, prior and informed consent for the implementation of the Bio-CLIMA Project has been governed by the traditional processes of the communities and territories and in accordance with the Political Constitution of the Republic of Nicaragua, Law 445 of the Communal Property Regime of the Indigenous Peoples and Ethnic Communities of the Autonomous Regions of the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua and the Bocay, Coco, Indio and Maíz Rivers, Decree No. 19-2008, approved on April 14, 2008 in Article 1, which declares in the Special Implementation Regime for the purposes of the Executive's Attention to the Indigenous Territories of Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum, Mayangna Sauni Bu and Kipla Sait Tasbaika, located in the Alto Wangki and Bocay Basin, Decree AN 5934 that ratifies ILO Convention 169, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, among other standards.

The methodology is based on the principles of traditional indigenous norms such as common good, collectivity, sharing, good faith, timely information, transparency, interculturality, profit sharing, flexibility and equality.

1.2. Bio-CLIMA Project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and Río San Juan Biosphere Reserves

The Government of Reconciliation and National Unity negotiated and received \$116.6 million in financing from the Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI) for the Republic of Nicaragua to implement the Bio-CLIMA project: Integrated Climate Action to Reduce Deforestation and Strengthen Resilience in the Bosawás and Río San Juan Biosphere Reserves. The funding comes from a loan from CABEI and a loan and grant from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) to address climate change by reducing emissions from deforestation, forest degradation, and livestock and improving carbon stocks. It will also directly impact the most vulnerable population in the Nicaraguan Caribbean area, supporting adaptation and reducing the negative effects that climate change has on their livelihoods, as well as improving their standard of living with the generation of higher incomes and more jobs.

The implementation of the Bio-CLIMA project is of great importance due to the severe damage caused by hurricanes Eta and Iota in Nicaragua. It is expected to directly (51,100) and indirectly (614,721) benefit 665,821 inhabitants of the Nicaraguan Caribbean Coast and the "Upper Wangki and Bokay" by introducing sustainable production models and forest management and reforestation in an area estimated at 603,035 ha.

Overall, Bio-CLIMA will allow carbon absorption capacity to increase by 14% by 2030 compared to the baseline scenario by promoting

agroecological cultivation of permanent crops in the shade of trees that are more resilient to the effects of climate change, reducing extensive grazing and introducing silvopastoral and agroforestry systems for cocoa, and establishing forests on fallow or degraded forest land; prioritize the natural regeneration of native tree species; restore and conserve ecosystems and ecosystem services using synergies in climate change adaptation and mitigation, with a particular focus on watershed management and risk reduction, such as biodiversity conservation and protected areas.

The project has three components:

Component 1: Conserve and Produce for Life (Direct Investment in landscape restoration and reforestation)

This component will finance activities focused on: (i) Development of land use/management plans and territories, development of community-level investment plans, productive development (livestock, cocoa) through the establishment of agroforestry and silvopastoral systems; and promotion of ventures for sustainable forest management of timber and non-timber products; (ii) Actions to restore productive landscapes and reforestation in degraded areas (Indigenous Territories within the BOSAWAS Reserve, the Indio Maiz Biological Reserve and its buffer zones and in twelve indigenous territories with the greatest risk of deforestation.

Component 2: Good Governance

This component aims to finance activities aimed at ensuring compliance with existing regulations, standards, and laws on forest management, land use, and environmental measures for the protection and conservation of the Caribbean. The activities aim to create an enabling policy and regulatory environment that paves the way for the transformation of extensive and destructive forms of land use into sustainable, climate-resilient practices, particularly targeting smallholder farmers and households at risk of deforestation.

Component 3: Capacity Development

This component will fund activities focused on promoting training and capacity building. Technical staff of public extension services, producers, and beneficiaries will be trained in integrated land use planning and management (PDT, POF), implementation and maintenance of production models for landscape restoration, investment and business plans, innovations in management processes, legislation and standards, strengthening of local organizations, quality management, and market access.

II MAIN CONTRIBUTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS OF THE REGIONAL ASSEMBLY

1. Mr. Donald Dixon of the San Andrés community: We are happy about this process, we have participated in the assemblies, we thank the central government for promoting the territorial and regional governments and we have observed that everything has been approved and we are happy to see that they are talking about the benefits. But after all this, we will formulate the sub-projects where the real needs of the communities are really taken into account. I know from experience that on many occasions this is done differently without really considering the needs of the communities. I ask that the ITGs be consolidated with the members.

2. Marcia Serapio from the Raiti Community: With regard to the great project that will be carried out in our communities, I am grateful for the management that has been developed to ensure the implementation of the project. If the project is implemented, I ask that the needs of women are taken into account and especially that many trainings are offered to women, because in the communities the rights of women are not made visible, in our territories the distribution of medicines is minimal, I ask that attention is improved.

3. Ms. Juana Cornejo of the Siksayari Community: I am the founder of IMAPAKST, we have fought for many years for the legal status of the women's organization, we even walked on foot in Managua, even when the president came out she was in the shadow of the Kunaspawa organization, at that time the women's organization asked for access to funds, I want this project to strengthen the women's organization.

4. Ms. María Concepción Dixon of the Peñas Blancas Community: Since October 21, 2023, the women's organization YAKMASBU has been operating independently for 8 years. We have faced challenges regarding our legal status as a women's organization. We are hopeful that our government, under the leadership of Mr. Michael Acevedo, the President of ITG-MSBU, will assist us with this matter.

5. Ms. Quelita Maxuel from the Community of San Andrés: We thank the people who are leading the project, we have been involved in these activities and that is good, the involvement of women in the process, although I do not think it is enough, because the participation should have been 50% in this project that strengthens the 3 women's organizations in the AWB, so that we can decide which projects to develop and have our own resources that allow our good performance.

6. Mr. Lalo Palma of the Andristara Community: We already know about the BIO CLIMA project, they have shared a lot of information with us and we are glad that we are the protagonists in the project, I support the approaches of women, I think it is necessary to support these organizations to strengthen them, we agree with the approach that we know from the project.

7. Jonny Pereira from the San Andrés Community: We are happy to be together for the first time and share information about the project. We see that everything that has been presented meets our requirements, to have a project like BIO CLIMA has always been a dream, we preserve the forests since our ancestors, so we have forest and it is good that the project ensures the preservation of forests.

8. Ms. Lastenia Dolores from the Waniwas community: We are happy about the project, and we feel that it has already been approved. We have preserved the forest that our ancestors inherited, and in this time when the loss of our forests is threatening, the project is to prevent us from losing these riches that we have. Some women's rights have been restored in the area and we hope to move forward to strengthen our organization and allow more women to participate in decision-making processes on an equal footing with men. The organizations are supported by the ITGs and I am grateful for this spirit of support from this organization, which is so necessary to respond to the demands of women.

9. Sr. Marcos Osorno of the Raiti Community: We thank God for this new opportunity to meet again. We have come from our territories to learn more about the process and to confirm the approval of the project, there is not much to discuss, we know that our communities in all areas have approved the project and we will reaffirm that support for the project. If there are people in the communities who for some reason do not know about the project, it is our duty to explain it to them. I believe that having forest implies knowing how to manage it in a sustainable way, we do not think about transforming our forests into grazing lands, because for us these lands are our livelihood, because we plant there, we gather there, and we hunt there. We must all commit ourselves to guarantee the preservation of the forest. For us, this is positive and a reason to rejoice, because we are consulted whether we want the project or not, which is a sign that the indigenous communities guarantee our rights and respect our values as the indigenous peoples that we are.

III FREE, PRIOR AND INFORMED CONSULTATION BY SHOW OF HANDS AND SIGNATURES FOR THE RATIFICATION AND VALIDATION OF CONSENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT

The consultation was carried out in the Miskitu and Spanish languages. The 47 members of the regional assembly were asked to vote by a show of hands to ratify and validate the results obtained in the territorial assemblies, ensuring the approval and implementation of the project. They received 47 votes in favor, 0 votes against and 0 abstentions. In accordance with the required quorum of 26 votes in favor, the territorial assembly approved the implementation of the project.

Representatives of the regional assembly, in accordance with the votes cast, were asked to sign the approval on the lists prepared for this purpose. They received 47 signatures approving and confirming the results of the consent to the implementation of the project, thus meeting the quorum for the consent to the implementation of the project; 0 signatures not giving their consent and 0 signatures abstaining.

The participation of 25 women represented 53%.

The three territories represented. Make a qualitative assessment of the participation of the different population groups and the barriers (or measures) that hinder (or facilitate) the participation of the community, especially women.

The Assembly was composed of people representing different communities of the Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum Territory. The Assembly had a total of 47 people. The consent vote reported 25 women and 22 men.

WOMEN:

- In the opening of the ratification, approved by the Assembly on the agenda, there were three women giving the welcome words, one for each of the AWB territories, corresponding to the women's organizations: Wimpa, Imapaks and Yakmasbú.
- There were nine comments or questions from people in the open dialogue space, five of them from women.
- There was one woman who asked to speak after the minutes had been read and before the vote, but was not given the chance to do so.
- The expressions and speeches of the women in the open dialogue space were linked to the themes of: violence (indicating that they still experience slavery), real opportunities for participation in communal and territorial spaces, the fact that the resources to which they have access are managed by the men of the GTI, need for independence in their functioning, absence of support from the GTI, lack of resources for mobilization to activities and overload in family care responsibilities.

*There was no evidence - from oral remarks - of participation of people or organized groups of Councils of Elderly, people with disabilities, LGBTIQ+ or sports, religious or youth groups.

6. Qualitative assessment, concerns or conflicts mentioned by the community (Max. 1,000 words)

1- (Man / From Miskitu territory Indian Tasbaika Kum):

After the projects, the sub-projects will arrive, and there it is necessary to include the needs of the communities and their experience to solve things. I ask the GTI to also analyze, work hand in hand with the community and territory.

2- (Woman / From Kipla Sait Tasbaika territory):

I am grateful for the project that is being consulted, and I ask that you provide us with more workshops on women's rights, because women still live in slavery. It is also important to look at the issue of health, where it restricts us to limited amounts of medicines in health posts. I also want to mention that the percentage of participation of women has been lost, since many are not taken into account in the spaces.

3- (Woman / From Kipla Sait Tasbaika territory / founder of women's organization Siksa Yari):

I have experience working in project management. We've had to struggle to be visible as women; we fight as an organization to obtain legal status, but under the umbrella of the GTI, when the financial funds come, the male leaders eat the money, and leave nothing. We ask to become independent to work on underlying issues, or to be respected as an organization by giving us the place we deserve.

4- (Woman / From Mayangna Sauni Bu territory / Organization of Mayagna women):

We do not have a legalized fund to work with, we only have legal personality, but the GTI does not support us. Everything comes out of our purse, we hope for more support.

5- (Woman / From Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum territory):

This project promises to work on gender equality and without discrimination, but since GTI includes us and although there are many women who are leaders they select, they do not give time to participate in these activities. There are factors that influence participation, such as not having money to move, having other responsibilities and not having time to participate. It is necessary that we do our part and have time to participate in all the activities promoted to discuss this project; Let's promote and show solidarity with all women so that together we advance and grow to live better, because our work will depend on bad attitudes.

6- (Man / From Kipla Sait Tasbaika territory):

We know everything about the BioClima project, it is important to know and it makes us very happy because it is a great hope for families. We appreciate the support of organizations in this process, thank God there have been no major incidents, and this project is being presented throughout the entire region of Nicaragua which is visible on social networks and will be something big.

7- (Man / From Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum territory / Municipal Councilor of Wiwili):

It is important to be all united in a space to discuss these issues. It is wise, there are many ideas and dreams that we have hoped for many years, and today it is reality, so we thank God and the leaders for all the effort made and we ask that they continue working hand in hand with us.

8- (Woman / From Miskitu Indian Tasbaika Kum territory):

I am very happy for the fruits that we have achieved, we have taken care of mother earth (rivers, forest, earth, air), we have to be well organized to work well with the project. We must work hand in hand with our people, we have to have greater participation as it is being established in the project and not stop participating in these decision-making spaces. Nobody is poor, we all have a mind full of wisdom that allows us to get ahead; Let's see this as a great opportunity to grow within the community and be a space to organize and share our experiences.

9- (Man / From Kipla Sait Tasbaika territory):

We have been struggling for a long time to be able to participate in this Assembly and there is nothing more to say about the work carried out in three territories and its approval. In our laws we are told that through the assembly by raising our hands we approve ideas for the benefit of the community. This is not man's idea but God's because he sees all the need we have and uses us to make it happen, that is why it is important to understand the entire process, remember about this process and its benefits. This project idea emphasizes caring for the environment and the impact it generates on all of us in a positive and negative way. But today there is a lot of transculturalization, adopting new work techniques in agriculture, livestock management, river care, protection of wild animals, and there is a great responsibility towards leaders to conserve our resources. They should not benefit the families that are damaging the environment, because they are the cause of the major

problems we face due to the mismanagement of natural resources. We see the need for the government to have this project consulted because this shows that they still respect our ways of life, culture and tradition. And thank you for the support we have from international organizations and for the literal translation that is given, which helps to understand the dimension of things in the territories where the 78 communities involved will benefit.

***At the time of the full reading of the Minutes of the Ratification Assembly, a supposed unanimous vote (of 47 people) was recorded, which at that time had not been carried out. After that, the people stood up and raised their hands in approval to take a picture.**

With this, what is indicated is that there was no actual voting moment to approve, reject or abstain, as stipulated in the minutes.

It is important to say that, as has been indicated in the previous observations, there have been a series of weaknesses when calling for a vote on the proposal, starting with the reference to "approval" instead of vote, then in other assemblies limiting themselves to only reviewing the votes in favor (without considering the votes against or abstentions) and finally going so far as to indicate in a record a vote that was not taken.

Components of the sheet:

3. Principles for the development of FPIC:

- **Reasonable term:** No, because there is little time between the presentation of the project, its evaluation and discussion (in an assembly on the same day) and the submission of ratification of consent to a vote.
- **Timely information:** Not entirely, because the Assembly was held in Miskito and Spanish (without asking the Mayangna-speaking people if they understood or if they needed translation).

It is also relevant to indicate that for the presentation of the evaluation of the process and request for ratification of consent there are inconsistencies in some data that are presented to the Assembly. For example, the total number of participants who supported it, where they added the "non-indigenous people" of the meaningful consultation, to reach the 537 people indicated.

7. Lessons learned / recommendations / areas for improvement (Max 1,000 words)

Differentiate in this space recommendations and areas of improvement for:

- **The organizing institutions of FPIC and MC**
 - It is advisable to establish a general consultation mechanism that, from the world view of each People and Territory, in its autonomy and self-regulation, establishes basic guidelines for the protection of the principles of free, prior and informed consultation.
 - It is recommended that there be more time to understand the project before the decision-making and voting in the consultation phase (to which this document refers).
 - **For greater freedom - as a principle of FPIC - during the voting process, a mechanism is recommended to ensure people's secret vote - instead of a public one by show of hands - (which is also recorded by photographs as people vote).) .**

- *For democratic balance, the practice of requiring only those who are 'against' the proposal to indicate this in the plenary session should be discouraged.*
 - It is recommended to use the word “vote” when calling for a decision on the proposal, rather than referring to “approval.”
 - It is important for security forces (police and army) not to be present in the discussion and voting area (for consent) during an indigenous consultation.
 - **It is recommended to investigate in greater depth and pay special attention to the relationship between payment of travel expenses and participation.** This because in several instances people stated that this was a payment made by the GTI for them to participate (as opposed to complementarities of their travel and food expenses). Although it was publicly expressed as logistical support managed by WFP, this relationship between exhibitor-consultant and payment for participation may weaken the freedom with which people participate and their right to oppose people who present projects for their consent.
 - The venues for holding the Assemblies for consultation on the FPIC must consider the best conditions for people's stay, or failing that, look for elements of environmental adaptation for issues such as ventilation, heat, hydration. It has been reiterated in the Assemblies of this territory, that the high temperatures significantly affected the full attention of the participating assembly members.
- **United Nations (UNOPS/WFP)**
 - It is recommended that emphasis continue to be given to the roles of UNOPS as observer and of WFP as logistical support, so as not to give participants the impression that these two agencies are responsible for the process.
 - It is recommended that it be further clarified that UNOPS is not in charge of the execution of the project, so that there is no confusion among the population consulted.
