Guatemala

Infrastructure and **Equipment Investment Program Equipment.**

CABEI Investment: US\$193.2 million (US\$79.0 million from Korea)

Construction of 63,495 m² and rehabilitation of 5,980 m² of infrastructure, which will improve care in 1,040 hospital beds.

Honduras

CABEL Investment: US\$30.6 million

Acquisition of goods and services: vaccines, supplies, logistics, coordination and organization support, communication campaigns, among others.

Acquisition of Ambulances for the **Health System in Honduras**

CABEI Investment: US\$4.39 million

Purchase of 32 fully equipped ambulances for the first and second level of care of the country's public health system.

+ 289,286 people from 19 municipalities in 16 departments at the first level of health care and inhabitants of 7 departments at the second level of health care.

Equipment of critical areas of the Gabriela Alvarado Basic Hospital, located in the city of Danlí, and the Santa Teresa General Hospital, located in the city of Comayagua.

CABEI Investment: US\$1.0 million

Acquisition of two ambulances, lots of medical and non-medical equipment for the Gabriela Alvarado Basic Hospital and for the Santa Teresa General Hospital, as well as an electric plant for the latter.

INICIATIVE DESCRIPTIÓN EXPECTED RESULT

Preliminary studies for the design, construction, equipment start-up of the National Laboratory for Biological Molecules, Genetics and Health Prototypes.

CABEI Investment: US\$357,500.0

The studies will provide, among others: diagnosis, structure proposal, previous studies for design, construction, equipment and start-up, and project profile.

Creation of a state institution capable of producing medicines, vaccines, reagents, prototypes and prostheses, paternity, sequencing and cytogenetic tests, among others, strengthening the public health network and improving access to health services.



Nicaragua

DESCRIPTIÓN INICIATIVE EXPECTED RESULT

Replacement of Nuevo Amanecer Regional Hospital in the North Atlantic Autonomous Region (RAAN).

CABEI Investment: US\$52.9 million

It includes areas of obstetrics and gynecology, neonatology, surgical center, intensive care, emergencies, surgery, orthopedics, internal medicine, chemotherapy, day hospital and outpatient clinic.

Strengthening the Capacity for Care in the Hospital Service Network in Prioritized Health Units.

CABEI Investment: US\$85.0 million

Construction of 6 modular hospitals in five cities in the country, with a capacity of 378 beds and their respective equipment. The initiative will strengthen the equipment of hospital services, which will allow for the isolation of patients diagnosed with COVID-19. An oncology outpatient clinic and its equipment will also be built at the Bertha Calderón hospital in Managua, and a molecular biology laboratory will be equipped.

During 2022, health fairs and vaccination days were held in all representative offices in the region, added to the Bank's commitment to provide access to clinics and specialist doctors to employees who, thanks to the Bank's physical expansion, are located not only in Central America, but also in South America, Europe, and Asia.
